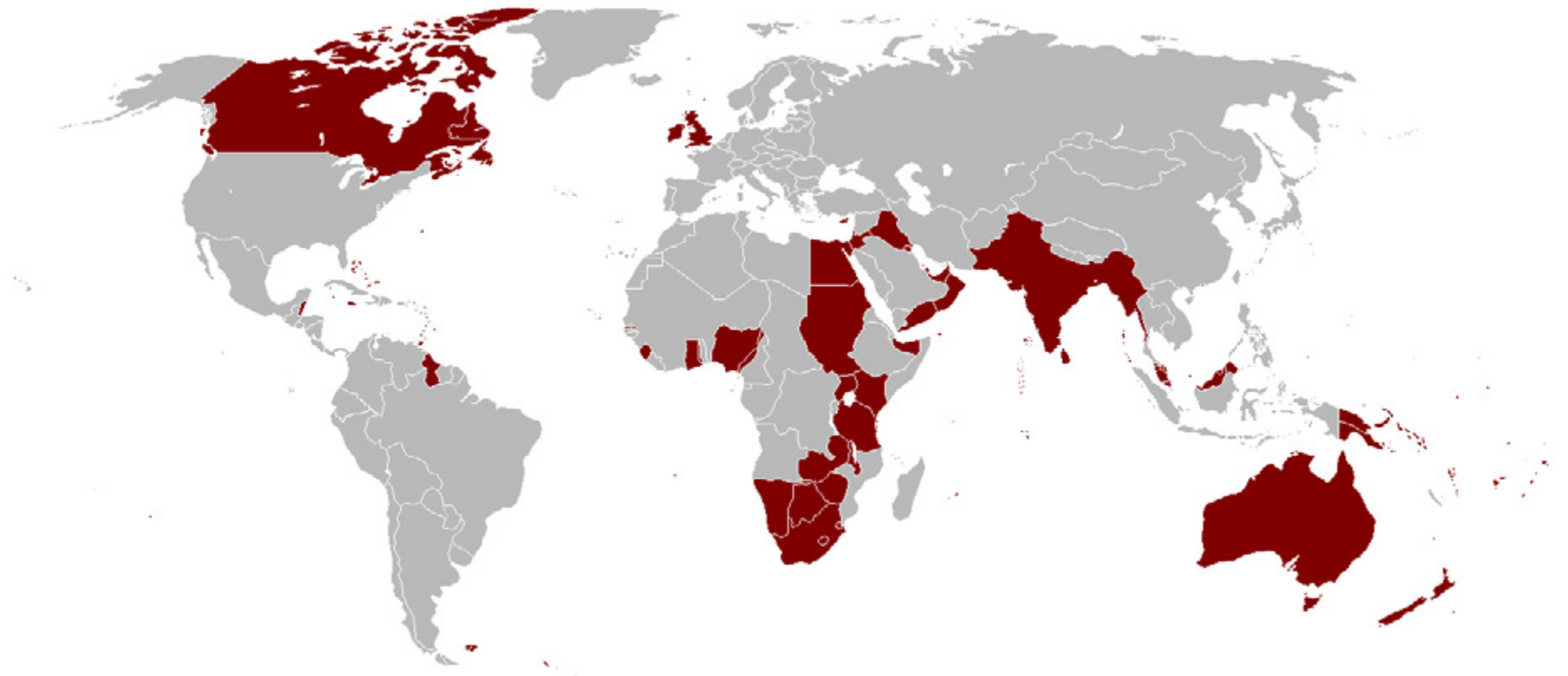

or National Library of Australia Atlas of the British Empire. Published in 1925

Shade and label the following on the map of Asia:

- the British colonies in one colour,
- countries of origin of migrants from Asia to Australia with a clear symbol
- other Asian countries in a second colour.
- Be sure to include the following in your map: a Border, Orientation(North point), Legend (key), a clear Title, Scale and Source of the map (BOLTSS).

The British colonies in 1923: India, Hong Kong, Penang, Malacca, Singapore, North Borneo, New Zealand, Tonga, Fiji, Western Samoa, Burma (now Myanmar), New Guinea, Papua Territory, Sarawak, Brunei, Ceylon (now Sri Lanka).

Country from which many pearl divers in Broome originated: Japan and Indonesia (Dutch East Indies), Timor, Malaya and the Philippines

Majority of Asian immigrants to Australia came from: China, Singapore, Hong Kong, India, Ceylon, Fiji, New Zealand.

Also locate and name: Thailand (Siam) Korea (now North and South Korea), Indo-China (Laos, Cambodia and Vietnam) Tibet, Mongolia.
